In addition to all the beautiful coral reefs and marine life they experienced under the sea, they furthered their knowledge on being responsible "stewards of the sea" by attending several evening presentations hosted by local experts. These were Coral Reef Restoration, Dive Against Debris/Project Aware, Shark and Fish Identification. The Scout Divers even participated in a Fish Survey by counting the number of a particular fish and then reporting back to their Dive Master. The final night at camp involved a traditional Luau where each crew tested their limbo skills. There is no doubt this was an experience of a lifetime for the Scouts and they all have an increased respect for the underwater world.

Scuba Adventure Camp at National High Adventure Sea Base

Several newly certified Scuba Divers from Troop 41 and one Scout from Troop 15 recently attended a 7 day "Scuba Adventure" camp at National High Adventure Sea Base in Islamorada, Florida. Florida Sea Base offers several Scuba and Sailing adventures for Scouts BSA. During the adventure our Scouts logged 11 Scuba dives at 6 different coral reef sites in the beautiful Florida Keys. They even dove on the wreck of the "SS Benwood". The SS Benwood is a 345' steam cargo ship that sunk during a collision with another vessel in 1942 off of the coast of Key Largo.





NYLT Leadership Academy

During our time in St. Louis, Missouri, we were the only two scouts representing Arizona and Grand Canyon Council. While there, Academy challenged what we knew about National Youth Leadership Training (NYLT) and presenting, and pushed us to be the best we could be. We met scouts and scouters from all over the country; representing 23 different states, and even more councils. We both made lasting connections that wouldn't have happened otherwise, and we can't recommend this program enough. Both of us are excited to see what comes next in our leadership careers.

Recently, we got the opportunity of a lifetime by getting a scholarship to the National Youth Leadership Training Leadership Academy (NYLT LA). The

skills taught at the Leadership Academy we're very similar to those of NYLT, except at the academy we were able to put that knowledge into use and learn to correlate real world problems/ teaching to the content of NYLT. At the Academy, presentations were a frequent test of our unders tanding of the Academy content. With a total of 5 presentations put on by participants, we covered the EDGE method, effective presentation activities, the stages of team development, problem solving/ conflict resolution, and leading yourself. Overall, the NYLT LA expanded our understanding of the NYLT course content and enabled us to bring other councils ideas to our own. The LA helped us better teach content using our own personal experience and go beyond syllabus material. We couldn't be more thankful for the opportunity to go to St. Louis, Missouri, and further my leadership experience.

According to Bryan On Scouting:

- 1. Stretch out the corners of the flag.
- 2. Cut the flag in half, vertically do not cut into the blue star field.
- 3. Place the two halves together and cut in half, horizontally.
- 4. You will have four pieces of flag, one being the blue star field and the other three red and white stripes.
- 5. Put the flag in a container and dispose of it properly.

If your troop is interested in doing more flag ceremonies, send me an email letting me know you're interested in receiving a "flag ceremony example kit" for Memorial Day, July 4th, Labor Day, and Veterans Day.

Scouts BSA Central District Flag Collection Project

With short notice, the Scouts were able to plan a flag collection project at the Royal Palm Park. In lieu of the park's usual July 4th festivities, they scaled it back tremendously this year due to the parks opening just before July 4th. Next year, we will be at full force and our park should be back to normal.

We were able to communicate to the Royal Palm Neighborhood, through Facebook, that we would be at the park to collect their flags for retirement. The neighborhood brought us 50 flags to be retired, while we collected another 10 flags brought to us by one of our local troops. Not bad for two hours that it took to collect them.

Watching the Scouts interact with neighbors bringing in their flags was heartwarming. The event brings a certain understanding for our Scouts to learn that the flag is an important symbol to many of us and how it is retired matters. Our Scouts instantly took in the flags and properly folded them accordingly in preparation to be retired.

Please keep in mind that toxic flags are forbidden to be retired by fire and must be retired by separating the stars and stripes. Once separated it's no longer a flag and can be disposed of properly.


Movie Making
