



Policy on Unauthorized Changes to Advancement Program





Incident Reporting will be a highly monitored reporting area in the Scout post-bankrupt operating environment. We need to ensure that all scout leaders understand what Incident Reporting is and why it is important that all incidents are accurately and timely reported. Scouting strongly encourages units to report any incident so Risk Management can ensure any unsafe conditions are addressed and safety measures are put in place. We may also recommend training that may need to be created or enhanced to ensure safety and for insurance purposes. 

Youth Training: Introduction to leadership skills

Introduction to Leadership Skills is designed to help the youth leadership of troops, crews and ships understand their new leadership roles and how to succeed in those roles.

The training consists of 3, one-hour modules. The training is best accomplished with the entire youth leadership group prior to them taking their elected and appointed leadership positions. The face-to-face training not only informs the youth of their roles and responsibilities as unit leaders, it also provides a great forum for team development of the group. It enables each to understand the roles of the entire leadership group and how their positions work together to form a successful leadership team. These courses were developed to help youth leaders learn and practice the attitudes and skills effective leaders demonstrate. The syllabus for troops, crews and ships can be found here:



There are also Online portions the youth can do on their own who are in troops and crews. To complete the training, there is a third module that is done face to face with the adult unit leader. The Online portions can be found at my.scouting. Click on the BSA Learn Center on the right side of the screen. From there, click catalog and type in Introduction To Leadership Skills and click on the search icon. There will be 2 modules each for troops and crews.

By completing Introduction To Leadership Skills, the youth is then entitled to wear the "Trained" patch for their respective position. Unit key 3 should then record the training in the training manager for each youth that completed the training.

Recording Youth Training

The unit key 3 has the ability to access the Training Manager in my.scouting to record face to face training that youth have completed. This would include Den Chief Training, Introduction to Leadership Skills, NYLT, NAYLE and the NYLT Leadership Academy and others. Youth training records are a part of the training manager and can be very useful in reviewing the training a youth has completed, eligibility for NYLT, potential NYLT staff selection and other roles of continuing youth leadership.

To add youth training, go to the Training Manager in the my.scouting website. Choose the "add/search" function. From there, select "Optional Youth Training". Most courses will be in this drop down box although additional training is in the "Other" drop down box or the program specific drop down. You can then select the appropriate course and the course dates. From there, add members and submit.


