



Q3 Report on Council Financial Operations



At the October 19th Executive Board Meeting, financial reports through September 30th were provided by Council Treasurer Todd Turner. Here are the highlights:

- 2021 continues to be a challenging year with national headlines challenging our local fund raising efforts. Our council benefited from the SBA's Payroll Protection Program by receiving a \$448,000 loan that has since been forgiven as part of the Federal Government's CARES Act.
- Total contributions are \$1,133,895, compared to a budget of \$1,470,299. This includes the PPP funds.
- Total revenues are \$1,954,196 compare to a budget of \$1,716,221.
- This puts total support and revenue at \$3,088,091 vs.
 \$3,186,520 budget.
- Total expenses are \$3,254,460 vs. a budget of \$3,276,382.
- Netting total support and revenues against expenses puts our year-to-date performance at -\$166,369.
- Looking at the remaining quarter, we are optimistic that the popcorn sale will exceed budget and several other fund raising projects will allow us to be close to break even on the year.




