MESSAGE FROM SCOUT EXECUTIVE

Recently about 40 Grand Canyon Council Scouters completed the practical phase of Wood Badge training, which is the premier adult leadership training available in Boy Scouts of America. These leaders (mostly volunteer, but with a few staff thrown in) came from local units, districts, and council roles. In fact, four members of our Executive Board went through the course!

Wood Badge is a mountain-top experience for Scouters and one that results in better program and outdoor adventures for our Scouts. After completing two weekends of practical training, Wood Badgers commit to completing a number of projects, called working their ticket as they complete the training and are ultimately presented with their Wood Badge recognition: a beige neck with a tartan swatch on it, a distinctive woggle (Slide), and a leather necklace with 2 wooden beads on it.

Earning Wood Badge beads is a big commitment of time and effort, and these Scouters are truly committed to helping youth have the best experience they possible can through Cub Scouting, Scouts BSA, Venturing, Sea Scouting, and Exploring. If you see a Wood Badger in the wild, be sure to thank them and ask about their experience. Maybe you'll find yourself joining the group in our next course (fall 2023).

IMPORTANT UPDATE - STEM Nova Award Program Ending November 18, 2022

Earlier this year, national BSA discontinued its support for the STEM Nova Awards program and stopped supplying patches and other recognition items. As a result, Grand Canyon Council will no longer be administering these awards. If you are currently working on a STEM Nova Award and would still like to receive your recognition items, please contact <u>gcc.program@scouting.org</u> by November 18, 2022, so that we can do our best to source them for you. GCC will not be able to provide any awards we were not notified about prior to November 18 and asks that Scouts do not begin any requirements after that date. If your unit has a Scout who has started the requirements for a STEM Nova Award, but will not finish by November 18, you should still request the recognition items on their behalf by that date in anticipation of their completion. Any recipients of these awards will still be able to view their advancement in Scoutbook.


